Community Rehabilitation Program

The Community Rehabilitation Program (CRP) is a comprehensive program that helps individuals with emotional, mental and physical disabilities accomplish vocational and personal goals.

Vocational Evaluation is a process that determines an individual's work capabilities, interests and transferable skills.

Vocational Skills Training prepares individuals for competitive employment through classes in customer service, food service, forklift driving, cash register operation and computers.

Work Adjustment Training offers individuals real work experience in a light industrial environment. Participants learn all aspects of holding a job, including clocking in and out, taking direction from a manager, communicating with coworkers and time management.



Workforce Development

Workforce Development offers several programs to help a variety of groups become self-sufficient.

Community Resource Centers offer job seekers support in computer labs, networking rooms and job training classes to residents of Alamance, Caswell, Guilford, Randolph and Rockingham Counties.

Jobs on the Outside is a comprehensive, collaborative initiative that provides individuals who have a criminal record with skills training, job search assistance, job placement assistance and other services as an alternative answer to recidivism.

Work First is a program that offers individuals referred from the Department of Social Services the opportunity to become self-sufficient through job training, career counseling and work experience training.

Wheels to Work offers qualified participants the opportunity to purchase reliable, affordable vehicles to ensure their continued success in the competitive job market.
